Kendra (Merriman) Diekevers represented Michigan at the 2018 Angus Women Connected Conference. She joined a progressive and enthusiastic group of 30 women from 19 states, who came together in Excelsior Springs, Missouri to share their ideas, knowledge and passion for raising Angus cattle.

### What is the Angus Women Connected Conference?

The American Angus Auxiliary offers learning, brainstorming and camaraderie for women at three-day annual retreat.

### What did you learn?

Kelli Retallick of AGI spoke about DNA, EPDs, and what each producer can do to improve their herd through genetic evaluation. She compared Angus EPDs to other breeds as far as birth weight, weaning weight, marbling, and milk. She also spoke about GeneSeek technologies and traits they are studying to include in future EPDs: foot structure, tenderness and cow longevity, to name a few.

### What new connections did you make?

I had the pleasure of sitting at dinner with Ashley Grant, Chief Marketing Officer of Ranch House Designs. She was informative on the current successful marketing avenues and what the constant changes in technology mean to us as producers. I was also in a small group discussion with the American Angus Auxiliary President, Leslie Mindemann, and Region 5 Director, Deanna Hofing from Indiana. We talked about the goals of the American Angus Auxiliary and each of us shared our goals in relation to the Angus breed.

### Did vou have some fun?

Yes! We listened to the hilarious parodies of "Cara Bout Aq," did a "chalk and chat" painting, and had free time to sample Missouri wines.

### What did you enjoy most about this experience?

It was very refreshing to meet other women who also know the everyday struggle of taking care of a family, working, running a farm, and balancing all of it....without having a complete breakdown! I met so many new people and made lifelong connections. I encourage all Michigan Angus women to apply the next time this opportunity is available.


