Seldom Rest Farms of Niles, MI was awarded Premier Breeder honors at the 2019 National Junior Angus Show in Louisville, KY. The Foster family bred the Grand Champion Heifer, Seldom Rest Sandy 8018, as well as four Reserve Division Champions. (Report on page 6.)

Michigan Angus Awards Banquet – March 7, Agro-Culture Liquid Fertilizers World HQ, St. Johns

Mark your calendar to spend an enjoyable afternoon with Michigan Angus friends. Note that the MCA/MSU Bull Evaluation Open House at Plank Farms in Crystal from 10 a.m to 1 p.m. is on the same day, and it's easy to attend both events. (More info follows below.)

MCA/MSU Bull Evaluation Report

Nineteen of the region's leading seedstock producers preconditioned and sorted their top sire prospects and delivered them to the MCA-MSU Evaluation Station at Plank Farm on October 11 and 12. Once they settled in, 78 prospects were weighed twice, on October 24 and 25, to start the 112-day evaluation period. All bulls are vaccinated and boosted at home for IBR, BVD, PI3, BRSV, M. haemolytica, H. somni, 5-way Lepto, and 7-way clostridial. Then, for additional activation of their immune system, the are boosted again for IBR, BVD, PI3, & BRSV.

After the first 28-days, two bulls gained over 6.5 lbs./day! Leading the way are: #44, Angus, from KB Farms, sired by 3F Epic 4631 and #76, SimAngus, from Rural Route 5 Farm, sired by WS All Aboard B80. The overall average ADG is 4.36 lbs./day. See the 28-day report for details at: www.mibulls.com/reports, and follow up regularly to access information on the progress of all bulls being evaluated.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All cattle must meet the Michigan Beef Expo health requirements before check-in time. All sale cattle must have negative test results for Bovine Viral Diarrhea (BVD) and all bulls must pass a Breeding Soundness Exam in order to sell.

In addition, the MI Angus Association has adopted the MI Cattlemen's Association Vaccination Stamp Program for cattle that will participate in the Futurity. Visit the MCA website for specific vaccination requirements: www.micattlemen.org; click tab on left side: Vaccination Stamp Program; click for Example Vaccine Combinations.

PENNED FEMALES: An individual consignor to the Futurity may enter up to three (3) REGISTERED, non-HALTERED females that are born on or after January 1, 2017. These cattle will not be shown. The consignor must provide certificates of registration from AAA. Cattle will be penned in a designated area of the MSU Pavilion. Please indicate on the entry form if your entries will be haltered and shown.

GENETIC TESTING: MAA requires sale consignments that are potential carriers of any known lethal genetic defect, for which there is a commercial test available, be tested. Test results MUST be available and provided when entries are submitted. Consignor is responsible for the cost of testing. If the animal is confirmed as a carrier, it will not be cataloged. If you are unsure of the status of your consignments, please call the American Angus Association at 816-385-5500. To discuss issues related to genetic testing procedures, please contact Casey Jentz, AAA Regional Manager at 608-234-1998.

DUES and ENTRY FEES: All consignors must be current members of the Michigan Angus Association. If not currently a paid member, please add \$25 for membership dues to your entry fee. All consignors to sales held in conjunction with the Michigan Beef Expo must also be members of the Michigan Cattlemen's Association. For more information regarding this policy, please contact MCA at 517-347-8117.

ENTRY FEE: \$100 per lot is due by January 25. Entries received after January 25 will be required to pay \$150 per head entry fee.

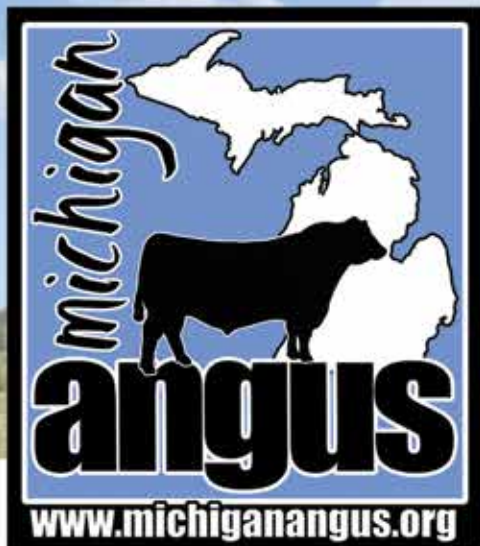

Michigan Angus' Most Distinguished Woman

During the American Angus Auxiliary's 2019 annual breakfast held at the National Angus Convention, Michigan's own Nancy Diuble Thelen was named a "Distinguished Woman" of the American Angus Auxiliary.

The American Angus Auxiliary honors "distinguished women" who have given outstanding service to the organization. They are dedicated women who have served in various capacities to further the goals of the Auxiliary, which offers individuals interested in the welfare of the Angus breed the opportunity to work together to provide educational, promotional and social programs and activities. Since 1960, 27 women have received this prestigious honor, exemplifying the dedication of many to the organization. Each woman has contributed her own particular talents and has proven to be a long time champion of the organization. They have devoted time as officers, committee members, and many other roles, all for the betterment of the Auxiliary and the Angus breed.



Nancy has been involved with Angus cattle before she was old enough to even join 4-H. She exhibited Angus on a local, state and national level throughout her youth. Along the way, she was humbled to experience several "firsts," including being the first person to exhibit four grand champion steers (all Angus) at the largest steer show in Michigan, the Detroit Junior Livestock Show. She was a charter member and director of the Michigan Junior Angus Association, the first Michigan Angus Queen, and the first person to serve as president of the Michigan Junior Angus Association, the Michigan Angus Association and the Michigan Angus Auxiliary. Nancy has served several terms as secretary or co-secretary of the Michigan Angus Association and shared her ideas, time and effort to organize the celebrations of the 50th anniversary of the Michigan Junior Angus Association and the Michigan Angus Auxiliary, and the 100th anniversary of the Michigan Angus Association. She has also enjoyed several terms as one of the advisors for the Michigan Junior Angus Association.

Nancy's involvement with the American Angus Auxiliary began when she was awarded the first place girls scholarship in 1970 and was named the 1970-71 National Angus Queen. After graduating from MSU she was asked to serve on an Auxiliary committee and her commitment has continued since then. From 2005-2009 she served as secretary-treasurer, president-elect, president and advisor for the American Angus Auxiliary. For the past ten years she has served as Finance Committee Chairman. Nancy has been a member of several committees over the years and helped to update the archives and guidelines of the Auxiliary.

Nancy has dedicated her life to Angus, agriculture, youth and her family. While in college she competed successfully on the MSU livestock judging team, and then taught school for a year, while she served as secretary of the Michigan Angus Association. She then accepted a position with Premier Beef in Minatare, Nebraska working as the coordinator of performance testing and sales. After the Nebraska facility was sold she joined Curtiss Breeding Service as one of three companywide beef sales managers. In 1979 she moved back to Michigan and started a 36 year career with MSU Extension. She served ten years as the Eaton County 4-H Agent, then 20 years as the County Extension Director in Washtenaw County and then six years as a statewide Agriculture Literacy Educator. Throughout her life she has focused on youth development, volunteer development, agriculture education and community growth. She has had meaningful impacts on both the individuals and communities with whom she has worked. Nancy has coached livestock and meats judging teams and judged livestock shows for more than 45 years and has positively impacted many young people.



Nancy and Steve Thelen have been married for 38 years and they have two wonderful daughters, Renee and Julie. Both were extremely involved with Angus cattle, and the Michigan and National Junior Angus Associations. Steve and Nancy are enjoying their three grandchildren.

Nancy is quick to say that she could never have followed her passions without all the love and assistance from her family. She is thankful to all those who have supported her throughout the years – from her parents and siblings to her husband and daughters and their families and the many friends, mentors and Angus breeders who have helped her whenever needed.

Nearly 900 Angus juniors and their families traveled to Louisville, Ky., to compete in the 2019 National Junior Angus Show July 14-20 at the Kentucky Expo Center. National Junior Angus Association members gathered with the mindset "Win, Place & Showing for the Purple" as they exhibited 1,194 entries during the weeklong event that included more than a dozen educational contests in addition to the cattle show. Scott Bush, Britton, S.D., judged the 746 owned heifers; Andy Higgins, Murfreesboro, Tenn., assisted in judging the owned heifers; John McCurry, Burrton, Kan., judged the 282 bred-and-owned heifers, 40 cow-calf pairs, and 52 bred-and-owned bulls; Shane Werk, Manhattan, Kan., assisted in judging the bred-and-owned heifers, bred-and-owned bulls, and cow-calf pairs; and Bob May, Mineral Point, Wis., judged the 74 steers.

2019 Michigan Beef Showcase & Michigan Angus Preview Shows – June 9, MSU Pavilion, East Lansing

Fifteen head of Angus cattle were exhibited at the 2019 Michigan Angus Preview Show. Grand Champion Female in the Jr. and Open Show was RW Sandy 802, a February 2018 daughter of Silveiras Style 9303 exhibited by Maggie Reid from Eaton Rapids. The Reserve Champion Female in the Jr. and Open Show was BNWZ Sara's Dream 8011, an April 2018 daughter of EXAR Syndicate 5955B exhibited by Kinsee Lettinga from Wayland. These heifers were also selected as the Junior Champion Heifer and the Reserve Junior Champion Heifer. The Senior Calf Champion was Seldom Rest Lucy 8135, an October 2018 daughter of Colburn Primo 5153 exhibited by Blake Pillars from Martin. The Intermediate Champion Heifer was BWAFF Pride 805, a May 2018 daughter of Leachman Saughatchee 3000C exhibited by Hannah Schroeder of Ruth. The Senior Champion Female was Seldom Rest Lucy 7104, an October 2017 daughter of Silveiras S Sis GQ 2353 exhibited by Delaney Bates from Sebewaing.

The Grand Champion Cow/Calf Pair was Windy Ridge Faith, a two year old sired by VAR Index 3282 and her April, 2019 bull calf sired by Oak Row Finley. The pair was exhibited by Justin Stoll from Grand Ledge.

The Grand Champion Bull in the Open Show was BWAFF Onsite 808, a September 2018 son of TCK PVF Oversight 6129 exhibited by Amanda Kosal from Deckerville. The Grand Champion Bull in the Jr. Show was Windy Ridge Finn, an April, 2019 son of Oak Row Finley exhibited by Justin Stoll of Grand Ledge. This bull was also the Reserve Grand Champion Bull in the Open Show.
